COMMUNITY INVESTMENT REPORT July 1, 2013-December 31, 2013

Because of your support:

- 196 teens signed up to participate in BJE March of the Living 2014. They will be accompanied by 10 Holocaust survivors who will share their moving stories of survival. The LA delegation will join 10,000 Jewish teens from over 40 countries in remembering our past, living the present and marching into the future.
- In October, BJE kicked off Generations LA 2, increasing to 17 the number of day schools BJE is assisting to actively build endowments. To date, the initial 12 schools combined have raised over \$16.7 million in cash deposits, pledges and legacy commitments.
- The Hebrew Professional Learning Network, formed this year, brings together over 20 Hebrew and Judaic administrators and teachers, to share successful techniques, and strategies and to brainstorm ways to maximize their students' Hebrew skills. The first "Share-In" focused on the use of technology in Hebrew language teaching. In February the group will focus on effective methods of assessing Hebrew language skills.
- JKidLA, BJE's information center for any and all Jewish educational opportunities, has increased its outreach efforts, resulting in 4,708 Twitter followers (@JKidLa), 2,310 e-blast subscribers, 730 Facebook likes, and 636 Pinterest followers. Additionally, in the past 6 months, the JKidLA website was visited by over 5,000 individuals totaling over 7,800 visits.
- The newly launched BJE Impact website is a one-stop site for teen volunteers and educators where they can find community service opportunities throughout the Los Angeles area along with Jewish service learning insights. BJE Impact now also includes reviews of different activities, pictures and blog entries by teen participants and a volunteer event calendar. BJE Impact will also be the platform for StepUp! an innovative tool to help educators and students navigate the B'nai Mitzvah project.
- 42 teens participated in BJE's Teen Service Corps Summer 2013 Day Camp. Teens took part in social action projects at organizations that fight homelessness and hunger while exploring their Jewish identities. Many participants were so moved that they committed to continuing this work during the school year.

These are just a few of BJE's innovative, dynamic and effective programs and services enhancing Jewish education in Los Angeles.
