Among many other BJE programs and services advancing Jewish education in Los Angeles, BJE is proud to share these highlights enabled by your support:

- BJE Impact engaged with 13 schools, camps, and youth groups in service learning projects, impacting over 1,000 students in the Los Angeles area,

and helping them connect to relevant Jewish lessons and Jewish values with volunteer opportunities.

- 213 Los Angeles teens are enrolled in BJE's 2018 March of the Living; they will be accompanied by 5 survivors and 25 staff members, including counselors, historians and health professionals. More than \$185,000 in BJEprovided tuition assistance has made it possible for 69 participating teens to share in this experience.

 The First 36 Project, a program of the Simms/Man Institute in collaboration with BJE and the Jewish Federation, started its third cohort of 13 Parent and Me educators from 9 schools throughout Los Angeles. The group receives neuroscience-based professional development to assist them in strengthening the parent-child relationship during the first 36 months of a child's life.

 As part of BJE's 80th anniversary celebration, BJE sponsored a Day of Service Learning, drawing a capacity crowd of individuals and families with children ages 2-16 to Shemesh Organic Farm in Malibu, CA. The programed modeled Jewish service learning and BJE Impact programs.

- **Day school endowments** continued to grow. **21 schools** supported by BJE in partnership with other organizations, foundations, and local investors, have **raised over \$53 million** in cash and legacy pledges.

- Over 2,400 families were connected with family-friendly Jewish activities and organizations across LA through BJE's JKidLA bi-monthly e-newsletter.
- In July 2017, Reshet-LA, a joint program of BJE and the Union for Reform Judaism launched a network for reimagining synagogue education.
 21 educators in 15 congregations have begun the process of transforming their religious schools.

Participants in Generations LA, a BJE program committed to raising endowment funds for BJE-accredited Day Schools - BJE also sponsored a Night of 80 Shabbats in celebration of BJE's 80th anniversary and Jewish education. 80 volunteer hosts of varying ages and reflecting a diversity of Jewish traditions welcomed nearly 1,000 guests into their homes to celebrate Shabbat and Jewish education.

- BJE assisted **24 schools** in accessing **over \$150,000 in government funds** for professional development and **over \$500,000 to assist students** falling behind academically.
