COMMUNITY INVESTMENT REPORT January 1, 2014 - June 30, 2014

Among many other programs and services advancing Jewish education in Los Angeles, BJE is proud to share these highlights enabled by your support:

- To date, 17 day schools have been assisted by BJE to actively build endowments
 through the Jim Joseph High School Affordability Initiative and Generations LA
 programs. They have raised a combined total of over \$23.6 million in cash
 deposits, pledges, and legacy commitments.
- Over 300 early childhood educators gathered at the Skirball Cultural Center for the annual Bebe Feuerstein Simon Early Childhood Institute, topping last year's attendance of 255. This year's institute was titled: "Today's Child" and featured workshops on cultivating self-esteem, integrating Judaica into student documentation and understanding children's play.
- 20 Los Angeles, teens who had never participated in an Israel program, participated in Epic Israel, a 25 day summer trip heavily subsidized by the Jewish Federation and the Jewish Agency.
- BJE's March of the Living 2014 delegation consisted of 10 Holocaust survivors and 189 teens, powerfully connecting past, present and future.
- 6 schools recently completed a 3 year Hebrew proficiency project, a joint initiative between BJE and Hebrew@theCenter, transforming Hebrew language education for their 1,600 students.
- BJE's 3rd annual Day School & Yeshiva Administrators' Retreat, "21st Century Learners: Integrating New Literacies Into Curriculum & Assessment," had representation from 25 schools across Los Angeles, Los Gatos and San Diego. Participants attended sessions on integrating digital, media and global literacies into teaching and learning and designing a 21st century professional development plan.
- JKidLA ran the Jewish Federation Parent & Me Voucher program, distributing 70 vouchers to families in the West San Fernando and Conejo Valleys attending a Jewish Parent & Me class for the first time.
- BJE Impact: the Center for Teen Service Learning launched a new website, <u>www.BJEImpact.org</u>, connecting teens, families and educators to community service opportunities and service learning programs.
- BJE convened a task force to explore new directions in complementary Jewish education to encourage participation in Jewish educational experiences, increase access to Jewish learning and enhance the quality of Jewish educational experiences.
