POSITION OVERVIEW

The Design Arts Teacher is a full-time teacher and member of the Architecture and Design Institute (A+DI), reporting to the Visual Arts Instructional Leader. The ideal candidate is comfortable working in a highly collaborative environment where value is placed on the skills and passions of the disciplinarian within a larger context of school mission and integrative thinking. Primary responsibilities include: teaching architecture and design classes, which are defined below, serving as a student advisor, and collaborating on school-wide programming as necessary and appropriate.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Monitor progress of each student for mastery of course content, providing intervention or differentiation when necessary and appropriate, and consistent high-quality feedback.
- Ensure relevancy by connecting course content to other academic domains and authentically exploring the relationship between course content, the Milken Community School mission, and the Portrait of the Graduate.
- Utilize collaborative and individual learning opportunities that support student growth.
- Design lessons that are well-sequenced in terms of content and developmental appropriateness, and based on current institutional curriculum.
- Develop learning experiences where inquiry, curiosity, and exploration are valued.
- Create a learning environment where students feel safe and welcome.
- Create an environment that encourages explorations and experiential learning.
- Demonstrate situational adaptability that balances the needs of social teens, the needs of the lesson, and teachable moments.

- Engage with students outside the classroom through office hours, extracurricular activities, clubs, and school-wide programming.
- Evidence of artistic expression and involvement in own artistic development.
- Ability to network and connect with resources in the local region for enrichment opportunities.
- Other duties as assigned.

QUALIFICATIONS

- Bachelor's degree or higher in Design or a related field; master's degree preferred.
- Previous teaching experience required; at the high-school level preferred.
- Knowledge of drawing, design, model construction, Adobe, Suites, and Sketch-up.
